WEEK 1 • NOVEMBER 25-DECEMBER 1

DEVOTIONAL: ISAIAH 9:6-7

We all know what it means to wait. Whether it's in line at the store or for an important phone call or maybe you remember the excruciating wait for Christmas to finally arrive. As you read through the passages listed for this week, take notice of the promises God makes about sending His Son. But also try to get a sense for the long wait God's people endured longing for the promised Messiah, the Rescuer and Redeemer to finally appear.

DEVOTIONAL: LUKE 2:1-7

As exciting as a text message or notification may be it is nothing to the rush of joy that happened the night God's Son was born. Though not many in the busy town of Bethlehem were even aware what happened in that stable. God pulled out all the stops. Some parents will send a creative birth announcement when their bundle of joy arrives, God hung a star in the sky, one so significant that Wise Men, from a far off land, took noticed and traveled a great distance to welcome the Child. But that wasn't enough, God also sent a chorus of Angles not a barbershop quartet this was a choir numbering in the thousands to sing the joyful song announcing the arrival of God's son.

The song "O Holy Night" captures in part what this moment brought.

"O holy night, the stars are brightly shining, It is the night of the dear Saviour's birth; Long lay the world in sin and error pining, 'Till He appeared and the soul felt its worth. A thrill of hope the weary world rejoices, For yonder breaks a new and glorious morn;"

DEVOTIONAL: JOHN 3:16-17

If you think back on all your Christmases can you pinpoint a few of your favorite gifts? Was it something big or meaningful? Was it special because of what it was or because of who gave it to you? Pastor and Author Tim Keller makes this observation about the incredible gift we celebrate during the Christmas Season.

"Jesus Christ came at Christmas, but He didn't just come. He was given. 'For unto us a child is born, unto us a Son is given ...' Jesus didn't just come. He was a gift. That's the central event of Christmas, and all the gift giving, in a sense, makes that real. Jesus was given. 'For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son ...' Jesus did not just come. He was a gift." Jesus is the gift and He is the gift that changes everything. The Classic Christmas song "Hark the Herald Angels Sing" reminds us what this gift means.

"Glory to the new-born King! Peace on earth, and mercy mild, God and sinners reconciled."

He Sends Us to Go Tell WEEK 5 • DECEMBER 23-31

DEVOTIONAL: DEUTERONOMY 6:4-9

For some reason I am surprised at how completely disinterested my kids seem to be when I retell the stories from my younger years. I can't understand why they are not spellbound by my tales of adventure and excitement.

Our key verse being from Deuteronomy this week may seem odd being that it is actually the week of the very event we have been leading up, it is the very climax of the Advent season. Happy Birthday Jesus! The Son has arrived. But these verses give us a strong encouragement especially for this season to be intentional about retelling the story of God's gracious, promise fulfilling, history shaping, life transforming gift of His Son.

In Deuteronomy, Moses tells the people of God after they have been rescued from slavery in Egypt and this holy moment where God gives His people 10 commandments for how to enjoy life with Him, to first let these words work deep into your heart, and secondly, to repeat them to their children. Repeat them to your children not just once but over and over again in all kinds of places and with different kinds of mediums. God's instructions to repeat and retell the story of what He has done is not based on the listener's interest but on the importance of the story they are repeating. His words and the story of Christ's arrival is the most important story we could tell. And we have clear instructions to go tell, and retell, and retell, and retell.

Let us, as those who have been transformed by Your arrival, repeat over and over again this incredible story of your coming.
